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Messages from Our Principal

Congratulations to our Stage 3 students

Stage 3 enjoyed this week's excursion to The Great Aussie Bush Camp, and maintained Wideview's excellent reputation for manners and behaviour. All students stepped outside of their comfort zone to take risks, some greater than others but all came away with a sense of achievement and personal growth. Trips such as this are extremely valuable for our students — both



from the learning and enjoyment of the activities and also the opportunity to develop independent life skills.



This last point is worth thinking about for parents. Whenever we take students on overnight excursions we notice that most of them are well and truly up to the challenge of organising themselves and their belongings, but many struggle. If you are already giving your children plenty of opportunities to learn these skills by teaching them to tidy their rooms, store their belongings systematically, assist in laundry duties etc., you are doing them a big favour. If you

tend to do all of these day to day jobs for your children, you are depriving them of opportunities to develop the abilities and resilience that they will need later in life – worth reflecting on.

What are you learning? Why is that learning important? (Learning Intentions)

It is important to us that our students understand what they are learning in class and to reflect on why that learning is important. Having clear goals or learning Intentions provides clear purpose for both the teacher and the students, and both can work together toward achieving these.

It allows for feedback to be focused on the lesson purpose and how to achieve that learning goal or intention. It also helps teachers and children to track how they are going with their learning and when they are ready for the next steps. When students and the teacher understand why they are learning what they are learning, they can see where today's lesson fits into the course of learning over time, what the end purpose is and they can begin to transfer that learning to other situations.

You can help us by asking the children what they have been learning at school and asking them to think about why this learning is important.

Emergency Planning/Practice

It is part of the Work, Health and Safety regulations that we prepare for and practice emergency procedures on a regular basis. Every 6 months we either practice a:

LOCKDOWN – A continuous bell rings and the students stay in their classrooms with staff. The blinds are drawn and the door locked. We use a LOCKDOWN if unauthorised persons enter the site or if there is an incident happening just outside the school property.

EVACUATION – An intermittent bell rings. The students and staff leave the buildings and assemble on the oval near the front gate. An EVACUATION would occur if a building was on fire.

Towards the end of the year we also practice bushfire procedures.

If you are on the school site when one of these practices occur you will be asked to go to the nearest room



NAPLAN Results

All Year 3 and 5 students completed NAPLAN assessments in Term 2. We have been informed that individual student reports will be sent to schools later this month. Once result packages are sent to schools, we will send each child's results home accordingly. Although there are some inconsistencies with comparative data (due to software problems in the on-line system), we will include some highlights of our NAPLAN achievements in future newsletters.


