### **Monitoring the Air Quality Index (AQI)**

The air quality index (AQI) is a measurement provided by the State Government to advise people of the pollution levels in their local area. It is an indication of how clean or polluted the air is in areas across NSW. Last week Cricket NSW advised that all games for children under 16 years of age were to cease once the AQI reached 150. On Tuesday the AQI averaged 349 for parts of the Upper North Shore The Department of Education has advised schools that:

Schools should look for ways to minimise exposure and adverse effects of bushfire smoke. These include:

- Stay indoors, with windows and doors closed, or stay in air-conditioned premises, if possible. Air conditioning can help to filter out smoke that gets into the building.
- Consider cancelling sporting events and unnecessary outdoor activities
- Keep staff and students indoors for recess and lunch breaks
- Keep students calm and avoid vigorous exercise

At Wideview Public School were are monitoring the conditions daily and have strong systems in place to keep the children safe. I encourage all families to consider downloading the "IQAir –AirVisual" app onto your phones to help you plan your own families movements.

### **Bushfire Procedures**

During the course of the week through parent conversations we were made aware of a need to repeat our bushfire course of action.

We submit to the DoE our extensive evacuation/management plans that are drawn up with the support of Emergency Services such as the Rural Fire Service

Below is a overview of the procedures should we be faced with the worst.

Please bear in mind that the DoE and emergency services will in most cases make early calls for school closures.

### Before school start time:

Listen to the radio for fire updates - Check the Wideview Public School Yourphoneapp for any alerts If there is a threat of fire, you will be notified via the App and email most likely the night before.

Notification of school closures also appears on the DoE website.

### **Evacuation Procedures or Shelter in Place**

- 1. School is contacted by SES to signal that evacuation is necessary. And will help make decisions regarding "shelter in place" or evacuate.
- 2. If we are evacuating the notification will go out on the App. Children will not be allowed to leave unless parent is present to sign them out.
- 3. If an evacuation is deemed to be unsafe as per Emergency Services advice we will shelter in place. Please do not call the school to see what's happening. We need these to be available for us to contact parents. Parents are requested to use their friend and community networks to collect their children should they not be able to in person. Please ensure the school has your written permission for the elected friend / community member to collect your child from school.

Remember we will only shelter in place if there are no other options. Our biggest concern is the movement of vehicles around Wideview Road in an emergency.

4. After the initial rush is over, remaining children will be brought together. Children can be collected from our school hall area. Please ensure that your child is signed out so we can track every student.

- 5. Staff will be evacuated if possible. The school will ensure there is adequate supervision for remaining students.
- 6. Staff will now begin to ring parents of remaining children. Parents will be asked to arrange for students to be collected by themselves or nominated person.

### **Code Camp**

We are very excited to announce that Code Camp will be running an after-school coding class at Wideview in 2020. Code Camp is an external company which runs similar programs at many schools throughout NSW. This program is suitable for children in years 2-6 at any coding skill level. The class will be run immediately after school on a Tuesday afternoon from 3:30pm till 4:45pm and will run for 75 minutes. There will be a ratio of 1 teacher for every 9 students and they cater for all skill levels within the one class. The cost will be \$260 per term for 8 weeks. To give our students a chance to settle in to the coding experience, Code Camp has offered us 9 or 10 weeks of lessons in term 1 for the price of \$260, however all subsequent terms will run for 8 weeks. Please note that the exact start date for the Term 1 code camp classes and the exact number of classes in term 1 will be advised closer to the time. ### **Uniform Shop**

The Wideview uniform shop has had a successful and busy year keeping the students looking their best in uniform. The start of the year saw uniform shop coordinator Kate Glenn managing flooding of our little shop and saving the stock from ruin. It has also been a time of change with Kate leaving the role and being replaced by new Wideview mum, Flor Muse. The committee has had a change as well with Caro Osborn taking on the role of chair person from Bec Szuba while Nic Jan has taken up the role of treasurer. Kylie Foster remains in the role of secretary. A number of new items have been introduced this year including sunglasses, and the girls pants and shorts are proving popular. The uniform shop has changed its opening day to every Friday 8:30- 10am and continues to open every second Monday 3-4pm. The pricing of a number of items has also changed, including a decrease in the price of girls dresses.

The shop would not run as smoothly without the support of volunteers and a big thanks to for giving up their time to support the uniform shop

### **WOOSHC**

WOOSHC has had a positive year we have grown to be able to cater for 115 children per session with plans to grow the service to 145 in 2020. We have had some amazing community achievements including the Bake Sale which is a tradition lead by our Year 6ers raising close to \$350 to sponsor Tasmanian Devils, a Quoll and money for the Koala foundation to plant more trees. We have also had Jasmine, on behalf of the only OOSHC in NSW, enter her artwork into the School's Reconciliation Challenge. Winning Judge's choice but also helping highlight Outside School Hours Care as a place where children are given opportunities to play and achieve. Our family partnerships have been valuable, and we have been lucky to have Darya's, Darcy, Ben and Holly's family come in and share with the children their culture, lives and work with us. We also hosted our first farewell lunch for our Year 6 children, and it was lovely to see so many of the children past and present come back, enjoy lunch and share their memories of WOOSHC. It has been a great year filled with lots of fun, happy memories, lost hats, handballs and shoes on the roof and a lot of friendships built along the way.

At WOOSHC our favourite foods are apples, sandwiches and milo. This year we have eaten 32 000 slices of apple, 450 loaves of bread and 24 large tins of milo, using 800 litres of milk.

### **Banking**

The P&C took over responsibility for the Commonwealth Bank Student Banking in 2019.

Through regular banking, students have the ability to earn prize rewards and the school benefits by receiving financial support in the way of commission from the bank, which can be used to supplement school resources such as books, technology and sports equipment.

There are currently approximately 25 students registered for student banking at WPS. We hope to increase the number of Students banking in 2020 by regular advertising in the school newsletter. So, please keep an eye out if this is of interest.

#### Canteen

The Canteen is an integral part of our school and has had a busy year in all aspects of its operation.

Our Canteen Manager Michelle, with support from the Canteen Committee and Volunteers, have spent many hours behind the scenes working on improving our Canteen in various ways including:

- Compliance with the Healthy Guidelines as outlined by the Department of Education.
- Our menu now has more options and we are cooking up a storm with more and healthier food.
- Developed in house cashbook to daily track funds in and out and tracking item costs.
- And undoubtedly, the most exciting news revolves around the Canteen extension and refurbishment.
  - Final details are currently being determined. Work should commence and be partially completed over the coming summer holidays. There will likely be a few weeks at the beginning of 2020 where the canteen extension will still be underway.
  - We hope to offer a 'pop-up' type canteen during this time. This will enable the canteen to still operate in some capacity via a reduced recess, lunch and snack menu.

The Canteen also ran the following activities during the year:

- A successful Easter Bun fundraiser which coincided with the Easter Hat Parade.
- A comprehensive morning tea for students, parents and staff on Open Day.
- Providing weekly newsletter updates on new products, volunteer opportunities etc.
- Continues to run 2 Facebook Pages and provides regular updates. If you haven't yet liked the Café for Kids Wideview Public School Facebook page, please do so, it is a great way to stay up to date.

We know the kids love our food. We're getting more orders, lots more sales, so much that we're running out of space and sometimes time to make it all. The canteen is at capacity each day.

During 2019, the canteen has made and served a staggering 8,000 pieces of mini pizza, 5,000 pieces of Anzac slice and over 600 cheese toasties. Over 30kgs of carrots were used in our salads, and 656 apples were slinkied. 2,000 hash browns were cooked and served, as were 13,200 chicken nuggets. Oh, we can't forget the 7 honey sandwiches..... And that's not including the other sandwiches, burgers, drinks and snacks etc. As you can see, busy, busy, busy!

The Canteen cannot run without the support and efforts of our amazing Volunteers. We thank them whole heartedly. If you have a spare hour or half a day, there are a number of ways you could help, either:

- Volunteering on a monthly basis in the Canteen to prepare or serve the meals and to serve over the counter at recess and lunch. This is actually a lot of fun. Michelle is a great teacher and every please & thank you, returned basket, smiley face drawn on a lunch bag, helping with the littlies at the counter, delivering forgotten lunches, and smile from a pizza makes our day
- Preparing and cooking our Canteen made Anzac slice
- Picking up the groceries from Coles on a Wednesday. The groceries are already collated and paid for and are ready to just pick up and deliver to school
- Collecting the Sushi from Darcies on a Thursday and delivering to school
- Helping to pack stock on a Wednesday or Thursday morning

### **Nature Playground**

After being successful in a Community Grant from Julian Lessor's office, the Wideview Nature Playground could get underway. The planning & design has been done for the grant, so now we are going about ordering items and putting in the hard work.

A wonderful team of families came for our first working bee where we cleared the ground and put into place the large bits of sandstone. Over the year, the snake & bridge went in- a huge thankyou to Simon Roy for building an amazing bridge, that the kids love to use. We were lucky to be able to put some of the grant money towards this.

More wonderful volunteers helped in a huge planting day - which was harder than we thought due to the layer of cement over some of the ground. It has been amazing to see the traffic the playground gets and has made me so happy that the kids get another imaginative play space. The final report had been handed in and all done!

Thank you to Mr McTernan and all the teachers for their support in this project.


