Messages from the Principal

Latest NSW DOE COVID-19 guidelines

There is a lot of new information.

Parents and carers are able to enter school grounds to drop off or pick up students but should continue to follow COVID-safe practices, including social distancing between adults of 1.5 metres and prompt entry and exit of the school grounds.

Parents and carers can attend school sporting events. School sporting events align with requirements for community sporting competitions and training activities in NSW.

All visitors attending, for any other purpose than dropping off and picking up students, must comply with sign-in arrangements.

Harmony day/Colour Run

This year Wideview is celebrating Harmony Day on Friday, 19 March, the actual day is on Sunday, 21 March. All students can wear mufti with something orange to school as a celebration of Australia's cultural diversity. Orange is said to be the chosen colour for Harmony Day. Conventionally speaking, the colour Orange signifies determination and meaningful communication, and represents mutual respect and freedom of thoughts and ideas. This is why Australian natives widely wear this colour in any form, be it a band, ribbons or other items.

As Friday is also our colour run day we are asking students to wear something orange but to also have a white t-shirt, if possible, which will show up the colour from the powder more prominently.

Assemblies

Assemblies are permitted but should be limited to less than an hour where possible. Parent/carers who are invited may attend however you must comply with physical distancing and personal hygiene requirements at all times. Please sign manual attendance forms and scan QR code at the entrance to the hall upon arrival.

As we can only seat about 30 parents, complying with the guidelines, in the hall we will be sending

invitations to class parents. If your child's class is running an assembly the class teacher will let you know and send an invitation for you to attend. Unfortunately, the invitation will be limited to one member per family. If you haven't received an invitation you will not be able to attend.

Naplan

In Week 9 this term, all students in Years 3 & 5 will participate in the online Practice NAPLAN Tests. This is in preparation for the actual tests which will be held next term from 10 May, during Weeks 4 & 5. Teachers will be participating in mandatory training sessions this week, to ensure consistency in test administration across all schools.

Health News

The single best way to protect ourselves from the spread of any respiratory infection is to maintain good hygiene standards. Please reinforce the following messages:

- 1. Practice regular, 20-second <u>hand washing</u> with soap and water. https://www.health.nsw.gov.au/pandemic/Publications/hand-wash-community.pdf
- 2. Cough or sneeze into your elbow or better still a tissue (and dispose of it immediately)
- 3. Stay at home if you are sick.

The teachers are asking students to wash their hands regularly throughout the day and we are ensuring that there is adequate soap available for students and staff.

COVID Symptoms and absences

In accordance with advice from NSW Health, parents and carers are reminded NOT to send children to school if they are unwell, even if they have the mildest flu-like symptoms. Schools will make arrangements for any students showing any symptoms. NSW Health have requested that schools encourage anyone who has even mild flu-like symptoms, to arrange to be tested through their local medical practitioner or one of the COVID-19 clinics.

Symptoms include:

- Fever
- Cough
- Sore or scratchy throat
- Shortness of breath
- Loss of smell/taste

Students with flu-like symptoms will need to provide a copy of a negative COVID-19 test result before being permitted to return to school. We ask that you please forward results to the office at wideview-p.school@det.nsw.edu.au please DO NOT send to the class teacher. When completing an absence note we kindly ask that you please be specific in terms of reasons, if only 'unwell' or 'sick' is noted the school will need to contact you for further information.

Parents are also reminded that students should not return until symptom free, regardless of whether they require a COVID test or not.

Where are we at overall....

It's great to see that all classes are off the mark and have raised at least \$500. We still only have an average of 12 children per class signed up. 4/5AV have the most kids signed up with 19 and we have 3 classes where only 8 kids have signed up. A total of 192 kids have an online profile, with 160 of those are fundraising online. We have over 400 children at Wideview so more than half our school haven't signed up yet. The child who has raised the most to date is getting close \$500 with 2 children sitting not far behind. Even if you can only raise \$10 it still goes towards the school.

Fundraising Amounts / Entry Fee

Unfortunately at present the participation rate is much lower than we expected with fundraising. We do have cost that need to be met in order to run the actual day. We are asking for those who haven't participated in the fundraising event to make a donation to the P&C. The Colour Run is an exciting and fun day and one of our big fund raising activities.

A reminder that all the funds raised go towards our wonderful school. Over the past 12 months the P&C have paid for landscaping around the play equipment and installed water bottle filling stations across the school amongst other things. 
