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Messages from the Principal

Limited COVID-19 Restrictions Still Apply

Students should not attend school if unwell, even with mild symptoms of COVID-19. Any person with any COVID-19 symptoms will be sent home and should not return until they have received a negative test result and provide a copy to the school, and are symptom-free. In circumstances where children have other medical reasons for recurrent symptoms a letter from their GP is sufficient to negate the requirement for a negative test.

Anyone who is unwell with COVID-19 symptoms and have been tested should self-isolate until a negative

result is received. Location of testing clinics are available via the NSW COVID-19 testing clinics website. All visitors to the school site must be well and symptom free, comply with sign-in arrangements, and the 1.5m physical distancing requirements.

Kiss and Drop

Please be sure to follow the expectations of the Kiss and Drop Zone as a courtesy to other drivers. The Kiss and Drop Zone is an area on Wideview Rd that enables you to drop your child off safely and quickly. The intention is that drivers do not wait in these zones so that traffic queues are minimised. In reality it only takes a few inconsiderate drivers to overstay in the zones and the system breaks down, leading to frustration and delays.

- The Kiss and Drop Zone is a "No Parking" area. The maximum stay is two minutes.
- Move to the front to make room for others.
- Drivers should remain with their vehicles at all times.
- When you leave home or school, ensure children are in their seats with their bags with them.
- Make sure children use the footpath side of the door when getting in and out of the car.
- Talk to older children with mobile phones to pay attention to cars pulling in, rather than looking down at their phones, as this slows the process.

Reconciliation Week, 27 May - 3 June

Next week is Reconciliation Week. Reconciliation week aims to create a reconciled, just and equitable community for Aboriginal and Torres Strait Islander peoples and other Australians. It aims to inform, support and inspire people to engage in reconciliation. The most significant part of Australia's rich cultural identity stems from our nation's First Peoples. Aboriginal Education is an important part of our national curriculum, and focuses on how we best support the personalised learning journeys of Aboriginal students as well as the skills, knowledge, understanding, values and attitudes that we want all students to hold with regard to Aboriginal histories and cultures.

Throughout each year, teachers incorporate Aboriginal history and culture into their teaching plans to ensure students have a deep perspective and understanding of the ongoing impact and influence Aboriginal Australians have nationally and internationally. In addition to teaching and learning experiences, our school authentically builds an 'Acknowledgment of Country' at our assemblies and whenever we host meetings. An Acknowledgement of Country is an opportunity for everyone to show respect for Traditional Owners and the continuing connection of Aboriginal and Torres Strait Islander peoples to Country. At Wideview Public School, we acknowledge that we meet, play and learn on traditional Aboriginal land, the land of the Dhurag people, we pay our respects to Elders, past, present and emerging, and extend that respect to all Aboriginal students, staff and visitors to our school.

Infant Bathroom upgrade

You will have noticed by now the work that is taking place on the infant's bathrooms. The old bathrooms have been gutted and initial work has begun for the installation of our upgraded bathrooms. We look forward to these structures being completed and the additional work around the school commencing soon. Although there will be some temporary changes to our school routines, the most important aspect is that students, staff and the community are safe while the work is being completed and that we can continue with teaching and learning and that in the end we will have wonderful new facilities to use. The executive staff

will constantly monitor the building work and any impact it will have during school time and make appropriate and considered changes. If you are moving through the school, please avoid the areas where work is occurring.

STEM Garden: Vertical Gardens

How can we make late 60's architecture cool? More importantly, make it feel cooler in summer, warmer in winter?

Why is this important as we consider the impact on climate change on our community? How can we modify our homes and schools to make them more sustainable? What are the benefits of lowering our carbon footprint? Can we become carbon neutral? Your children will ponder these questions when using the vertical gardens learning space at Wideview Public School.

By creating vertical gardens on the western-side of our classrooms, we want to lower the ambient temperature in our classrooms and also use less electricity to cool or heat our classrooms. This wall of living green can be used to reduce the heat stored in the bricks - making it cooler in summer, warmer in winter. A wall full of flowers to mark the seasons, a series of apartment blocks for our smaller creatures to call home or a vista for all those who pass by to admire, inspire or question.

Our vertical gardens would also give our students another place to learn. Think about the STEM activities our students can engage in as they:

- monitor temperature inside the classroom,
- calculate the water required to irrigate our wall
- study the interactions that the wall encourages
- discover which plants thrive in these conditions.

We plan to start with F Block (Year 1).

SRC - Adopt an Animal

Please help the SRC adopt an animal by wearing mufti and bringing a gold coin donation on Tuesday, 15 June.

Our mufti theme is ANIMALS. Students are encouraged to wear animal themed clothing like animal prints, animal logos or the colours of their favourite animal.

This is a very exciting opportunity for Wideview Public school, to adopt an animal from Taronga Zoo (not to live at our school of course, but to sponsor for one whole year).

Our adoption will fund Taronga's work with research and education programs, focusing on endangered species in Australia and around the world, as well as assist with the conservation, breeding and preservation of wild animals and their habitats.

Students from Kindergarten to Year 6 will get to vote for one of the seven different animals. These include the Bilby, Koala, Tasmanian Devil, Sumatran Tiger, Asian Elephant, Red Panda and Meercat.

SRC students have been busy making informative posters about each of these 7 animals to put up around the school. The animal with the most votes, will be announced on the last day of school at assembly in Week 10.

SRC students will keep the school updated on our adopted animal. A small display with a framed photo will be put in the office foyer.

Our goal is to raise \$250. This is achievable, if each family sends in a gold coin donation.

COVID Symptoms and absences

In accordance with advice from NSW Health, parents and carers are reminded NOT to send children to school if they are unwell, even if they have the mildest flu-like symptoms. Schools will make arrangements for any students showing any symptoms to be collected. NSW Health have requested that schools encourage anyone who has even mild flu-like symptoms, to arrange to be tested through their local medical practitioner or one of the COVID-19 clinics.

Symptoms include:

- Fever
- Cough
- Sore or scratchy throat
- Shortness of breath
- Loss of smell/taste

Students with flu-like symptoms will need to provide a copy of a negative COVID-19 test result before being permitted to return to school. We ask that you please forward results to the office at wideview-p.school@det.nsw.edu.au please DO NOT send to the class teacher. When completing an absence note we kindly ask that you please be specific in terms of reasons , if only 'unwell' or 'sick' is noted the school will need to contact you for further information.

Parents are also reminded that students should not return until symptom free, regardless of whether they require a COVID test or not.
