Parent Teacher Interviews

Semester 1 Reports will be sent home today with students.

In Week 10, you will have the opportunity to meet with your child's teacher to discuss their current achievements and learning goals for Semester 2. A school wide interview afternoon is scheduled for Wednesday June 23 from 3:30-6pm. Alternatively, individual teachers will have other allocated times throughout Week 10 for you to book into.

You should have received a link from your child's classroom teacher to a Google form on Tuesday June 15 to book in a 10min interview time. The booking form will close this afternoon so if you haven't made a booking, please do so today. Please note: only select one 10min time slot.

On arrival on site, please sign in using the QR Code which will be located on the door or entry area to your child's classroom. Teachers will share as much information as they can with you and address any questions you have. Being respectful of each family after you, please arrive on time for your interview. Teachers understand how valuable your time is and will be aiming to keep to the time allocated for each family.

I look forward to wandering around throughout the afternoon and meeting as many of you as I can. If you are unwell, please refrain from being on site and contact your teacher to reschedule for a phone or face to face interview.

Afternoon Pick Up – Back Gate (Lonsdale Avenue)

Prior to my arrival, parents had been advocating for further traffic supports to aide in ensuring our students are safely crossing the road from school to home. A traffic study has taken place has been reviewed and at this stage does not suffice for further changes to take place. Recommendations were given and as a school we will always have your child's safety as a number one priority. As of this week the following supports are in place.

Staff on back gate duty will:

- wait a few minutes after the bell and lead the students down the staircase to minimise the afternoon rush down to the gate and out to the crossing.
- wear fluro vests when supporting students to cross the road as a visual to drivers and pedestrians.

We would appreciate and welcome you to wait for your children on the inside of the school fence or on the school side of the crossing to support students safely walking across the road with you. This is also a recommendation from the council.

It is of concern when drivers neglect to follow road rules, particularly when driving in a school zone. We will continue to be in contact with the local police unit and local council to address concerns when drivers neglect to respect the safety of our school community, particularly our students. We have been notified by the local council that Rangers have been requested to monitor and enforce parents to not stop to pick up in the no stopping zone.

We will continue to keep you updated with School Crossing Supervisor options we are investigating for morning and afternoon pick up at both the front and rear crossings of the school.

We thank you for your cooperation and support.



COVID Symptoms and absences

In accordance with advice from NSW Health, parents and carers are reminded NOT to send children to school if they are unwell, even if they have the mildest flu-like symptoms. Schools will make arrangements for any students showing any symptoms to be collected. - Loss of smell/taste

Students with flu-like symptoms will need to provide a copy of a negative COVID-19 test result before being permitted to return to school. We ask that you please forward results to the office at wideview-p.school@det.nsw.edu.au please DO NOT send to the class teacher. When completing an absence note we kindly ask that you please be specific in terms of reasons, if only 'unwell' or 'sick' is noted the school will need to contact you for further information.

Parents are also reminded that students should not return until symptom free, regardless of whether they require a COVID test or not.


