Bike, Road and Carpark Safety

In the past week, we have had community members, parents and staff contacting the school out of concern for students and their safety.

Students who ride to and from school were reminded of the importance of keeping safe whilst on their bikes as a group today. If your child rides to and from school, please reiterate the message of remaining alert, careful and to slow down on blind corners and intersections.

Kiss and Drop families this morning dropped off and moved on like clockwork. If you drive your child to and from school, please be aware of the rules of Kiss and Drop zones and think twice about completing u-turns near the school zone.

It goes without saying that the safety and welfare of our students is our top priority. A key danger that young children face is from cars. For this reason, it is vital that we keep the school driveway and carpark safe at all times. This means parking only in the designated car spaces. Parking on the grass or oval is not permitted at any time. If there is no space in the carpark, please park on the street. A further reminder that the carpark may only be used by school staff and contractors between 8am and 4pm daily. Thank you for helping keep our students safe.

The Hornsby Council has let us know council rangers may be patrolling the school zones. We have included road safety information in this week's newsletter from the Hornsby Council website.

Parking and traffic rules in school zones

You need to take extra care when driving and parking in school zones. Make sure that you and your child understand the road rules. If you break the traffic rules in a school zone you are putting not only your child but other children at risk. The parking and traffic rules around our schools are there to protect your children. If you break the rules you will be fined. **Please choose safety over convenience**.

Demerit Points:

* The **Demerit Points** Scheme is a national program that allocates penalty points (demerits) for a range of driving offences. A driver who has not committed any offences has '**zero**' points. If you commit an offence that carries demerit points, the points are added to your driving record.

If you incur the threshold number of demerit points within a three-year period, a licence suspension or refusal is applied. The three-year period is calculated between the dates the offences were committed. It ends on the day your most recent offence was committed. Parking Rules

Please park safely and legally on the streets around your school. Park legally so you do not incur parking fines and demerit points. Council's Traffic Compliance Officers enforce parking around schools. If you park contrary to the road rules you will be fined!

You cannot stop or park your vehicle:



Parallel parking

This is the usual way to park unless signs tell you otherwise. You must park in the same direction as the adjacent traffic and parallel and as close as possible to the kerb.





Parking Rules

No Parking Zone

- Drivers may stop in this zone to drop off or pick up passengers or goods for a maximum of 2 minutes.
- The driver MUST remain in or within 3 metres of the vehicle at all times.
- The vehicle must not be left unattended.
- If times of operation are shown on the sign, the restriction only applies during the times shown.
- · No Parking zones can also be used to drop off and pick up children.

No Stopping Zone

- Stopping is not permitted at any time.
- · If times of operation are shown on the sign, the restriction only applies during the times shown.

Penalty: \$272 or \$349 in School Zone + 2 Demerit Points

Safe Walking Tips

- Always use pedestrian crossings.
- Never assume that a driver can see you or will stop for you. Their vision may be affected by the sun, poor light, parked cars or other distractions.
- Remember that drivers take longer than usual to stop in the rain or on a wet road.
- At intersections, check for turning vehicles before you leave the footpath and while you are crossing the road.
- Children up to ten years old should hold an adult's hand in the car park, on the footpath and when crossing the road.
- Avoid using a mobile phone, head phones or other device while you are crossing the road.
- Watch out for bicycles.



Bus Zones Drivers are not permitted to stop within a bus zone at any time.

 If times of operation are shown on the sign, the restriction only applies during the times shown.

Double Parking

- Drivers are not permitted to stop or park between the centre of the road and another vehicle that is parked at the side of the road.
- Double parking decreases visibility for motorists and pedestrians, and

COVID Symptoms and absences

In accordance with advice from NSW Health, parents and carers are reminded NOT to send children to school if they are unwell, even if they have the mildest flu-like symptoms. Schools will make arrangements for any students showing any symptoms to be collected. NSW Health have requested that schools encourage anyone who has even mild flu-like symptoms, to arrange to be tested through their local medical practitioner or one of the COVID-19 clinics.

Symptoms include:

- Fever
- Cough
- Sore or scratchy throat
- Shortness of breath
- Runny Nose
- Loss of smell/taste

Other reported symptoms include fatigue, acute blocked nose, muscle pain, joint pain, headache, diarrhoea, nausea/vomiting, loss of appetite, unexplained chest pain and conjunctivitis.

Students with flu-like symptoms will need to provide a copy of a negative COVID-19 test result before being permitted to return to school. We ask that you please forward results to the office at wideview-p.school@det.nsw.edu.au please DO NOT send to the class teacher. When completing an absence note we kindly ask that you please be specific in terms of reasons , if only 'unwell' or 'sick' is noted the school will need to contact you for further information.

Parents are also reminded that students should not return until symptom free, regardless of whether they require a COVID test or not.
