Messages from the Principal

We thank Mr Parks for his efforts in ascertaining a Sustainable Schools Grant. We are using the remaining grant funds to create a community garden at the Lonsdale Ave entrance to the school. ICAS Assessments 2022

ICAS is an online academic competition that is designed to assess students' higher order thinking and problem-solving skills in English, Mathematics, Science, Writing, Spelling Bee and Digital Technologies.

All parents with children in Years 2-6 were sent a SchoolBytes email earlier this week explaining the details. ICAS Assessments will take place on school site in Term 3. More information will be shared in Term 3 to the interested students and families. The ICAS assessments will be run throughout August and into early September.

Premier's Spelling Bee Competition

In Week 10 of this term, students who self-nominated will participate in the first round of the competition with other students in their grade only. The audience is student only for this round. Students who progress to the next round (early Term 3) will compete in a Junior (Years 2-4) or Senior (Years 5 and 6) Competition. Parents will be invited to attend this round. The strongest speller in each competition will then attend the Regional Premier's Spelling Bee as our school's representatives.

Playground Equipment Usage at Pick Up and Dogs on Site

We recognise our furry friends love to also attend school drop off and pick up. We kindly ask that you please ensure you remain outside of the school gates when you have dogs with you.

The playground equipment is not for after school use for students. Please refrain from allowing your children to use this space at pick up time. The WOOSHC educators use this space and supervise the students attending after school care.

Semester 1 Reports

Students will bring home their Semester 1 report on Wednesday June 29. If your child/ren need a duplicate report, and you have not already informed the school, we kindly ask you to do so before Monday June 27.

Industrial Strike Action – Thursday June 30

The Department of Education has been negotiating with the NSW Teachers Federation since October last year to reach an agreement on the new Teachers Award. On Tuesday June 21, the NSW Teachers Federation directed its membership to take industrial action in the form of a 24-hour strike on Thursday June 30 2022.

We will notify families of our school's operation status through a SchoolBytes email over the coming days. Thank you in anticipation for your support and understanding.

Due to the Industrial Strike Action, our K-2 students will have to wait just a little bit longer to run their cross-country race. We will reschedule this day early in Term 3 and look forward to them all having their turn to run.

Weekly Assembly Change - Term 3

As of Term 3, our weekly assembly is moving from Friday mornings at 9:15am to Monday afternoons at 2:25pm. This will be trialled in Term 3. Friday mornings are a core learning time for our students and teachers. For our Years 3-6 classes, sport also takes up a proportion of the day. We are grateful to have our families join us at our weekly assemblies and appreciate your understanding as we trial the afternoon assembly time.

Parent Calendar Term 3

Before the end of term, families will receive a Term 3 Parent Calendar to help plan for the term in advance. The weeks are already filling up with exciting events and engaging activities being prepared.

We appreciate our students, staff and families have been faced with not only COVID health concerns but have had to fight off the flu hitting our community members this term. I wish all of our students, staff and families remain healthy and well through the Winter break.

Staff return for Staff Development Day, Monday July 18. All students commence Term 3 on Tuesday July 19.

NAPLAN Item Trial

Our school has been selected by the Australian Curriculum, Assessment and Reporting Authority (ACARA) to participate in this year's ACARA Item Trial, to be conducted using the Online National Assessment Platform. NAPLAN Item Trial tests have occurred each year since 2007.

The aim of the Item Trial is to evaluate NAPLAN test items that are under consideration for inclusion in future tests. The trial will be conducted in schools from Monday 18 July to Friday 26 August 2022 this year. We will confirm our school's trial date early in Term 3.

At least 25 and no more than 40 Year 3 and Year 5 students per grade are asked to participate. We will select students who participated in NAPLAN this year without additional adjustments or supports to take part. Both groups of students will participate in an Item Trial for Reading and Numeracy on school site using the same online system of NAPLAN 2022. The Item Trial bears no individual score or student report. If you do not wish your child to participate, please contact your child's teacher prior to the end of Term 2

Athletics Carnival 2022

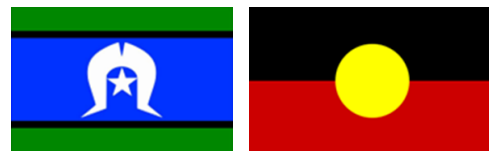

Share Our Space – School holiday access

Wideview Public School has again been selected as a Share Our Space setting over the holiday break. Share Our Space is a commitment by the NSW Government to make schools the centre of the community.

Since our school hosts vacation care, the outdoor facilities at our school will only be open from 8am to 5pm on the following weekends:

- **Saturday 2 July and Sunday 3 July**
- **Saturday 9 July and Sunday 10 July**
- **Saturday 16 July and Sunday 17 July.**

A sign will be positioned at the front of the school to highlight the Share Our Space expectations.

We appreciate the support of the school community over the weekends and holiday breaks. The School Security Unit contact number is 1300 880 321.

Close Contact Reminder

Thank you for continuing to support our guidelines by keeping children at home when they are presenting with cold, flu and COVID symptoms. Rest and recovery remain the first priority. If your child is able to complete work whilst at home, please discuss this with your child's teacher. Any student, staff member or volunteer, who are close contacts, can attend school site. RAT testing for 5 days and wearing a mask indoors remain per our current guidelines. We wish our students, staff and families speedy recoveries when affected by illness.

Unwell at School

Any student or staff member who is unwell and/or displays symptoms of COVID-19 will be asked to go home and remain offsite until they can complete a RAT or PCR test.

- If symptoms continue, they should stay at home and take another RAT in 24 hours or have a PCR test.
- If the second RAT or initial PCR test result is negative and they are displaying no symptoms OR they are diagnosed as another condition such as hay fever, the student or staff member can return to school.

NSW Health and the Department of Education would like to remind our schools of the full list of COVID-19 symptoms that communities should continue to look out for.

Symptoms include:

- fever (37.5 degrees celsius or higher)
- cough
- sore throat
- shortness of breath (difficulty breathing)
- runny nose
- loss of taste
- loss of smell
- nausea/vomiting
- loss of appetite

Other reported symptoms include:

- fatigue
- acute blocked nosed (congestion)
- muscle pain
- joint pain
- headache
- diarrhoea

Unexplained chest pain and conjunctivitis (eye infection) have also been reported as symptoms of COVID-19. If anyone develops any of these symptoms they should get tested and isolate until they receive a negative test result.

When completing an absence note we kindly ask that you please be specific in terms of reasons, if only 'unwell' or 'sick' is noted the school will need to contact you for further information.

If a student or staff member is unwell and has any [symptoms](#) they should always test for COVID-19, either with a rapid antigen test (RAT) or PCR (nose and throat swab) test.

If the test comes back negative for COVID-19, the student or staff member should still not return to school until either:

- the student no longer has any symptoms, or
- a medical certificate is provided to the school confirming that symptoms are explained by another diagnosis (such as hay fever).

It is important that students do not attend school if they are unwell, even if they have tested negative for COVID-19. RATs can produce false negative results and symptoms of other illnesses can also be similar to COVID-19, including flu, the common cold and stomach bugs. Health advice is that students who are sick should always stay home to rest and recover and avoid putting other students and staff at risk of getting sick.

A reminder that if a student records a positive RAT, they/their family must register the positive test on the [Service NSW website](#) or [Service NSW app](#) so they can be linked to important health care support and advice. Please remind your parents and carers to ensure that they select your school name when prompted when registering a positive test result for their child.

Look out Wideview – we've got some great things coming for Term 3 – we're looking forward to sharing news of these early next term.

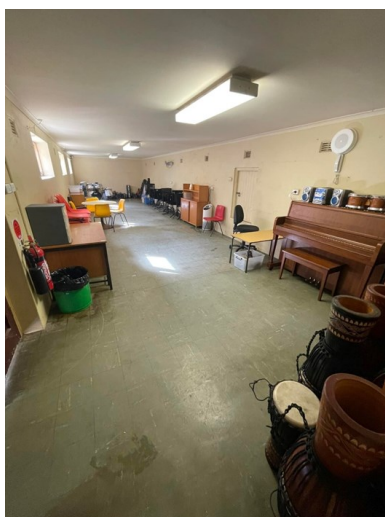
Volunteers 'clean up' at Wideview Working Bee

Disco information for parents and children

Arrival and Departure:

Children to arrive at the school hall at the beginning of their session. All children must be picked up promptly at the end of each session from the hall. No children will be allowed to leave without a parent or guardian there to escort them from the hall.

Time:

Infants (kindy, year 1 and 2): 5.30-6.45pm

Primary (years 3, 4, 5 and 6): 7-8.30

Food and Drinks:

Children will be able to go to the canteen for a juice popper (flavours vary) and either a packet of popcorn or chips. Children will receive a stamp or texter mark on their hand once they pick up their food and drink. Food and drink must be consumed outside the hall, in the canteen area, to prevent spills and mess in the hall. We recommend children bring a water bottle with their name to be placed on the water bottle table near the canteen – bubblers are also close by if needed. No other external food or drink is allowed

Medical information:

We will have a First Aid station where children's medical kits (epiPens/asthma puffers) can be kept while the children participate at the disco. Please ensure Medical kits are clearly labelled with child's name (photo if possible) and that Anaphylaxis or Asthma plans are in the kit.

Mrs Pitts and a parent who is a doctor will be at this station. If your child is anaphylactic you would feel more comfortable being at the disco, please contact the office to volunteer for the evening.

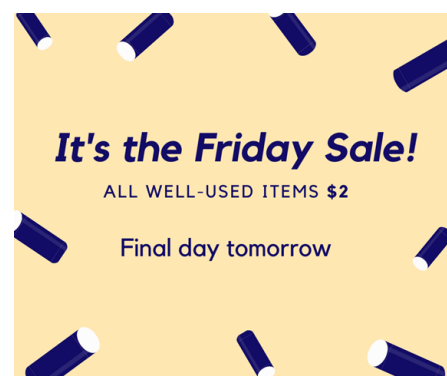

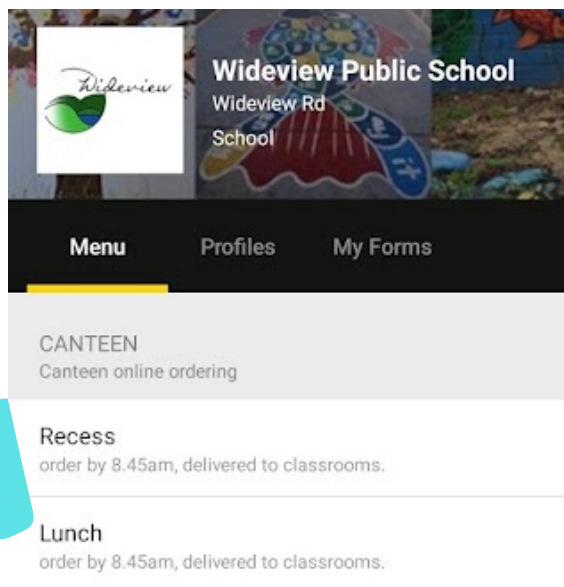
