

#### Is it Rude?, Is it Mean? or Is it Bullying?



Ensuring our school is a safe and respectful space for all learners, we are continuing to discuss, teach and support our students to act with kindness, integrity, and respect towards their peers. Is it Rude? Is it Mean? or Is it Bullying? references the different levels of how we feel when hurtful words, actions, or gestures occur. Every student has the right to come to school to feel safe and secure. Teachers and SLSOs across the school, have been supporting students with friendship and social etiquette. It is vital students know they can speak to their classroom teacher or another member of staff when they need advice or support. It is also

imperative that we continue to create a culture where students trust the adults in their world to be able to talk to them about what may be making

them feel upset or concerned.

Staff have continued their training in the Zones of Regulation wellbeing program and are using this language regularly with their students. This consistent language and the activities that revolve around the zones of regulation is supporting students to explain how they feel, why they feel that way and how they can feel differently. It is also supporting students who may have been rude, mean or bullied a peer to recognise how that makes others feel.

We are now, and will continue to, learn what tools we can use to help return to the green zone. #### **Unwell at School**

Any student or staff member who is unwell and/or displays symptoms of COVID-19 will be asked to go home and remain offsite until they can complete a RAT or PCR test.

- If symptoms continue, they should stay at home and take another RAT in 24 hours or have a PCR test.
- If the second RAT or initial PCR test result is negative and they are displaying no symptoms OR they are diagnosed as another condition such as hay fever, the student or staff member can return to school.

NSW Health and the Department of Education would like to remind our schools of the full list of COVID-19 symptoms that communities should continue to look out for.

#### Symptoms include:

- fever (37.5 degrees celsius or higher)
- cough
- sore throat
- shortness of breath (difficulty breathing)
- runny nose
- loss of taste
- loss of smell
- nausea/vomiting
- loss of appetite

Other reported symptoms include:

- fatigue
- acute blocked nosed (congestion)
- muscle pain
- joint pain
- headache
- diarrhoea

Unexplained chest pain and conjunctivitis (eye infection) have also been reported as symptoms of COVID-19. If anyone develops any of these symptoms they should get tested and isolate until they receive a negative test result.

When completing an absence note we kindly ask that you please be specific in terms of reasons, if only 'unwell' or 'sick' is noted the school will need to contact you for further information.

If a student or staff member is unwell and has any <u>symptoms</u> they should always test for COVID-19, either with a rapid antigen test (RAT) or PCR (nose and throat swab) test.

If the test comes back negative for COVID-19, the student or staff member should still not return to school until either:

- the student no longer has any symptoms, or
- a medical certificate is provided to the school confirming that symptoms are explained by another diagnosis (such as hay fever).

It is important that students do not attend school if they are unwell, even if they have tested negative for COVID-19. RATs can produce false negative results and symptoms of other illnesses can also be similar to COVID-19, including flu, the common cold and stomach bugs. Health advice is that students who are sick should always stay home to rest and recover and avoid putting other students and staff at risk of getting sick.

A reminder that if a student records a positive RAT, they/their family must register the positive test on the <u>Service NSW website</u> or <u>Service NSW app</u> so they can be linked to important health care support and advice. Please remind your parents and carers to ensure that they select your school name when prompted when registering a positive test result for their child.



### Parking near driveways, footpaths and pedestrian kerb ramps



#### Parking near driveways

- When parking legally near a driveway, you must ensure that no part of your vehicle blocks the driveway or access to the property at any time.
- A vehicle can be parked up to the wings of the driveway.
- A driver can drop off or pick up a passenger in front of a driveway, however it is an offence to leave a vehicle unattended or to not move their vehicle at the request of the property owner.

# Parking near footpaths and pedestrian kerb ramps

- When parking legally near a footpath or pedestrian kerb ramp, you must ensure that no part of your vehicle blocks access to the footpath or kerb ramp at any time.
- A vehicle can be parked up to the wings of the pedestrian kerb ramp.
- By parking correctly and considerately, you allow other vehicles and pedestrians to access properties or footpaths easily and safely, creating a safer environment for other road users.
