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Messages from the Principal

Welcome back to our students, staff and families.

Term 4, here we go! We are off to a wonderful start with our students returning to school with positivity and excitement for the term ahead.

Our Spaces have had a Mini Makeover

At the end of Term 3 and throughout the holiday period, almost all of our learning spaces and administration areas were updated with a fresh coat of paint. We are sure you'll spot the difference the next time you're on site.

Students Last Day of Year - Changed

Students will now finish school on Friday, 16 December 2022.

This is due to an additional School Development Day announced for staff across NSW public schools for Monday, 19 December 2022.

School Development Days allow our staff to participate in professional learning that was put on hold due to COVID-19 staffing pressures and plan ahead for 2023 to ensure we meet the needs of our students.

With this change, we ask that you arrange alternative care for your child on Monday, 19 December.

Our WOOSHC service will be operational for this additional day.

If you are unable to find alternative care for your child, please inform the school.

Tell Them From Me Survey

The Tell Them From Me suite of surveys provides school leaders with insights into student engagement, wellbeing, effective teaching practices, communication and partnerships at their school, from the perspective of students, staff and parents. The survey for parents is optional. To ensure anonymity for parents, schools create a unique URL that will allow access to the survey for their school only. We will send families the unique URL via a SchoolBytes email. Students in Years 4, 5 and 6 are completing the survey with their classroom teacher. The survey window closes Friday, 4 November 2022 for all surveys.

Check In Assessments (CIA)

Late Term 3, Year 6 students completed assessments for writing, reading and numeracy. This term, students in Years 3, 4 and 5 will complete CIA for reading and numeracy. Students will be supported by their class-room teacher when completing the assessments. Whilst there is an approximate time for each test, there is no time limit. Students are encouraged to work at their own pace. The CIA data is used by teachers to continue to monitor and identify strengths and areas of improvement for individual students.

ILSP and Zones of Regulation Parent Zoom Sessions

The Zones of Regulation is a social and emotional wellbeing framework that supports students and adults to identify how they feel and their emotions. Using tools and strategies, we can develop how to support and self-regulate our emotions. The Zones of Regulation Parent Zoom is scheduled for Wednesday 19 October at 6:30pm for 45minutes. In this session, Mrs Anthonisz will share how we have implemented the framework at school and discuss practical ways this framework can be used to support your children.

ILSP stands for Intensive Learning Support Program. We have used ILSP funding this year to support students who needed support, encouragement or revision of literacy and numeracy concepts. The groups are run by our SLSO team with teachers and SLSOs working closely together. Throughout the year, we have been able to target over 100 students across K-6. Parents are notified if their child is working within a small ILSP group. Mrs Anthonisz is hosting an ILSP Parent Zoom Session to share how the program has been working and examples of what learning takes place.

The ILSP Parent Zoom is scheduled for Wednesday, 26 October at 6:30pm for 45minutes.

Links and details for both parent Zoom sessions will be shared via a SchoolBytes email on Monday, 17 October.

Summer Uniform

At times it feels like Winter is still lingering. Commencing Term 4, our Summer uniform is encouraged to be worn by all students.

Our Summer uniform items are as follows:

- Blue and white checked dress, with white collar and inverted pleat at front
- Black school shoes & white or grey socks
- Navy school hat
- Mid blue short sleeve shirt
- Grey or navy shorts

All students are asked to wear a hat whilst outdoors. Students who are not wearing a school hat in the playground are asked to play under the covered areas of the school. Please label all hats and jumpers so they can be returned easily. We appreciate uniform items are costly and always prefer to be able to return items to the rightful owner.





Road Safety

We all have a part to play in safe driving practices in and around school zones to protect our students. Please remember the Kiss and Drop Zone is not a parking area. It is designed for students to be quickly dropped off whilst the driver remains in the car. Staff are on duty to try and support the students to safely exit the car and assist the queue of cars to continue to flow. Please respect the cars in front and await your turn to exit back onto the road.

At the end of Term 3, we reminded our students who ride scooters and bikes to and from school, of the dangers of crossing roads and to not cross on a corner or crest in the road. We also spoke with students, after reports from concerned community members were given to the school, of students riding and swerving on the road in front of traffic. We thank you for continuing to reiterate the same conversations with your children, to ensure they are as safe as they can be, when riding without an adult present. Ride Safely to School Week is coming up in Week 3 of this term. Our safety message will continue to be shared regularly with our students.

Year 5 Student Leader Nominations for 2023

It's that time of the year again when our Year 5 students prepare a speech to present to the student body, sharing their aspirations and interests of becoming a student leader for 2023. Our Year 5 students received a self-nomination form this week and have until Tuesday, 25 October to return the form to school. Unwell at School

Any student or staff member who is unwell and/or displays symptoms of COVID-19 will be asked to go home and remain offsite until they can complete a RAT or PCR test.

- If symptoms continue, they should stay at home and take another RAT in 24 hours or have a PCR test.
- If the second RAT or initial PCR test result is negative and they are displaying no symptoms OR they are diagnosed as another condition such as hay fever, the student or staff member can return to school.

When completing an absence note we kindly ask that you please be specific in terms of reasons, if only 'unwell' or 'sick' is noted the school will need to contact you for further information.

It is important that students do not attend school if they are unwell, even if they have tested negative for COVID-19. RATs can produce false negative results and symptoms of other illnesses can also be similar to COVID-19, including flu, the common cold and stomach bugs. Health advice is that students who are sick should always stay home to rest and recover and avoid putting other students and staff at risk of getting sick.




