In the spirit of this year's theme 'hats off to teachers', I take my hat off to all the teachers at Wideview. Thank you for creating rich learning opportunities for your students and a supportive environment for all.

Assistant Principal Curriculum and Instruction

As part of a \$256 million investment, the NSW Department of Education announced that every public primary school across NSW will receive a dedicated Assistant Principal Curriculum and Instruction (APCI) allocation in 2022/23. This permanent position has an explicit focus on leading schools with evidence-based teaching and assessment to improve student outcomes. The APCI role will support strong instructional leadership, coordinate professional learning for teachers, monitor student outcomes, and support families to be key partners in learning. As our school was fortunate to have a 0.6FTE APCI allocation (3 days a week), we combined our position with Brooklyn Public School (0.2FTE - 1 day) and Cowan Public School (0.2FTE - 1 day) to make a shared full-time position. This allocation has been filled with Mr Greg Curran who is currently working as an Assistant Principal at Woy Woy Public School on a Stage 3 class. He comes to all our schools with high expertise in leading curriculum instruction. Our schools are looking forward to further strengthening our already great partnership through this shared APCI position. We can't wait to have Mr Greg Curran, join our team at Wideview Public School at the commencement of 2023.

Tell Them From Me Survey

The Tell Them From Me suite of surveys provides school leaders with insights into student engagement, well-being, effective teaching practices, communication and partnerships at their school, from the perspective of students, staff and parents. The survey for parents is optional. To ensure anonymity for parents, schools create a unique URL that will allow access to the survey for their school only. When: Wednesday, 16 November AND Thursday, 17 November, 2022


Times: 3.00pm until 6.30pm both days

Unwell at School

Any student or staff member who is unwell and/or displays symptoms of COVID-19 will be asked to go home and remain offsite until they can complete a RAT or PCR test.

- If symptoms continue, they should stay at home and take another RAT in 24 hours or have a PCR test
- If the second RAT or initial PCR test result is negative and they are displaying no symptoms OR they are diagnosed as another condition such as hay fever, the student or staff member can return to school.

When completing an absence note we kindly ask that you please be specific in terms of reasons, if only 'unwell' or 'sick' is noted the school will need to contact you for further information.

It is important that students do not attend school if they are unwell, even if they have tested negative for COVID-19. RATs can produce false negative results and symptoms of other illnesses can also be similar to COVID-19, including flu, the common cold and stomach bugs. Health advice is that students who are sick should always stay home to rest and recover and avoid putting other students and staff at risk of getting sick.
