Textbook Orders for 2023


Information has been sent to families of how to purchase textbooks directly through LJHarper for students K -6. To guarantee delivery please place your orders prior to Thursday, 9 February.

Before the end of the year, Mrs Griffin will send out communications to each family of their child's Best Start assessment date and time. If you have any questions prior to receiving this information, please contact the school office. Our 2023 Kindergarten students will commence school Monday, 6 February 2023.

School Organisation and Class Formations 2023

The placement of students into their new classes each year is an important and complex process. This includes teachers and I determining class placements to ensure a smooth transition for all students. Each year, we do our best to create positive and productive learning environments.

With our student enrolments fluctuating and increasing over the last two weeks, we are yet to determine class structures and will confirm our 2023 class structures in the new year. We are anticipating that in 2023, we will have 13 classes across K-6. Our primary classes will follow a stage-based model of 3/4 combined and 5/6 combined classes. Our class structures are created based on the number of students in grades and with strong teaching and learning objectives in mind.

We bid a sad farewell to families who are not returning to Wideview in 2022. Some families are moving interstate or to other areas of Sydney. We thank you for being a part of the Wideview community and wish you and your children well. Please contact the school in writing if your child/ren are not returning to Wideview in 2023. This information supports us to have the most accurate student enrolment numbers. It is also helpful to inform us of your child's last day in attendance and the name of their new school.

Intake area adjustment for Asquith Boys and Asquith Girls High Schools

As part of the department's assessment of school infrastructure in our area, a need to expand the enrolment intake area for Asquith Boys and Asquith Girls High Schools has been identified. This change will provide more certainty to families in our area knowing they will be able to enrol their child/children at their closest government high school.

From Tuesday 6 December 2022, students living in the local intake area of our school will have the in-area entitlement to enrol at Asquith Boys High School and Asquith Girls High School. This will be in addition to our current co-educational option of Ku-ring-gai High School.

- All prospective parents and carers are encouraged to look at the SchoolFinder website from Tuesday, 6
 December to view the updated intake area for the Asquith schools.
- There is no change to the co-education option and intake area for our school community, this remains Ku-ring-gai High School.
- Families who have already completed an out-of-area application for Asquith Boys or Girls High School will be automatically considered in area from 6 December and do not need to complete another application form.

Students who wish to enrol at a school that they do not live in-area for are able to apply and will be considered on a case-by-case basis in line with the <u>department's enrolment policy</u>.

Curriculum Updates

In 2023, K-2 students and staff will be engaging with new syllabi for English and Mathematics. Throughout 2022, staff have been involved in professional learning sessions to prepare for the mandatory implementation of these documents in 2023.

In 2023, staff across the school will be engaging in professional learning sessions on a regular basis to familiarise themselves with the new primary syllabus documents for English and Mathematics. These will be released as a mandatory requirement to guide teaching and learning in all the 3-6 classrooms from 2024.

Emergency and Bushfire Plans

We are currently updating our emergency and bushfire plans in consultation with the DoE Health and Safety team. Our school is in a bushfire prone area and is listed as Category 2 on the NSW Department of Education's bushfire risk register.

Category 2 Schools means - Schools in bushfire-prone areas with high landscape-to-site bushfire risk. The department will direct the school to proactively temporarily cease school operations on days when a Catastrophic Fire Danger Rating has been declared for the following day, or on advice from emergency services or the State Emergency Operations Centre.

We have included a two-page Bushfire Danger Period Information to Parents which includes updates to bushfire signage and suggests important ways to keep up to date and alert in the bushfire season.

Unwell at School

Any student or staff member who is unwell and/or displays symptoms of COVID-19 will be asked to go home and remain offsite until they can complete a RAT or PCR test.

- If symptoms continue, they should stay at home and take another RAT in 24 hours or have a PCR test.
- If the second RAT or initial PCR test result is negative and they are displaying no symptoms OR they are diagnosed as another condition such as hay fever, the student or staff member can return to school.

When completing an absence note we kindly ask that you please be specific in terms of reasons, if only 'unwell' or 'sick' is noted the school will need to contact you for further information.

It is important that students do not attend school if they are unwell, even if they have tested negative for COVID-19. RATs can produce false negative results and symptoms of other illnesses can also be similar to COVID-19, including flu, the common cold and stomach bugs. Health advice is that students who are sick should always stay home to rest and recover and avoid putting other students and staff at risk of getting sick.



Bushfire Danger Period Information for Parents and Carers

This brochure provides information for parents and carers about arrangements for the bushfire danger period.

The NSW Department of Education has engaged external experts to conduct assessments of all NSW government schools to identify schools at greater risk of impact from bushfires.

To support the health, safety and wellbeing of students and staff in your school, the department in consultation with NSW Rural Fire Service, will direct the school to temporarily cease operations on days when a Catastrophic Fire Danger Rating has been declared for your school's NSW Fire Area. Alternative learning arrangements will be put in place for these days.

In addition, schools may be made non-operational due to changing higher risk conditions and relevant advice from emergency services.



What is a Fire Danger Rating?

Fire Danger Ratings describe the potential level of danger should a fire start. The ratings are determined by a combination of factors including air temperature, relative humidity, wind speed and drought. The new Australian Fire Danger Rating System has four ratings; Moderate, High, Extreme and Catastrophic.

When will I know if my child's school has been made non-operational?

At approximately 4:00 pm each day the Fire Danger Rating is issued for the following day. This means that schools, including onsite preschools, will be notified after school hours that it will be non-operational the following day. Your school will notify you as soon as possible by the preferred method of communication.

Parents and carers are requested to:

- · Provide up-to-date home and after-hours contact details to your school.
- · Stay up-to-date with news and local media a through the bushfire danger period.

The run up to Christmas and the holiday period can be especially chaotic and stressful. Here are some tips to help you get through it safely, as well as how to prepare for school travel in 2023.





Double **Demerit Points**

Double demerit points apply for speeding, seatbelt, mobile phone and motorcycle helmet offences during the following holiday period:

Christmas Day to New Years

Beginning of Friday 23 December 2022 to end of Monday 2nd January 2023 (inclusive)



The January school holidays is a great time to start planning how your family will travel to school in 2023.

Walking, cycling or catching a bus to school is a great alternative to school zone congestion.

- Plan and practise safe travel routes with your child/ren.
- · Identify safe crossing locations.
- · Discuss how to spot dangers, like vehicles exiting driveways, and how to cross where there is no crossing facility.
















Parking Rules

Please park safely and legally on the streets around your school. Park legally so you do not incur parking fines and demerit points. Council's Traffic Compliance Officers enforce parking around schools. If you park contrary to the road rules you will be fined!

You cannot stop or park your vehicle:




Parallel parking

This is the usual way to park unless signs tell you otherwise. You must park in the same direction of travel and parallel and as close to the kerb as possible.



You can NOT park across driveways or pedestrian kerb ramps. A vehicle can be parked up to the wings on the driveways or ramp (see image)

PENALTIES FROM: \$275* Demerit Points apply in School Zone



You should park at least one metre from any other parked vehicle and entirely within any marked parking lines where provided (see image)

PENALTIES FROM: \$117



^{*} Penalty amounts are substantially higher for offences committed in School Zones

Teaching chidren road safety

Keeping kids safe

Learning about road safety starts from the time a child begins to walk. As children grow they start to use our road network in different ways, from riding scooters and bikes through to using public transport. Parents are not always going to be around to supervise so it's important to teach kids about road safety from a young age so that they can be safe on and around our roads.

There are many practical ways to help your child by teaching them:

- to understand timing and speed
- how to cross roads safely
- to see a dangerous situation and respond appropriately

You don't have to be a road safety expert to do this!

Teaching Learner drivers - The facts



- Learner drivers are statistically less likely to be in a crash than other drivers.
- The risk of being involved in a crash increases for young drivers once they get their probationary licence.
- Learner drivers need a minimum of 120 hours of logged driving practice before they can sit for their probationary licence test.
- A learner driver must log a minimum of 20 hours of night time driving. When L plate drivers move to their probationary licence they're at a much greater risk of being in a crash at night.
- Gaining experience in all conditions helps to improve driving skills and reduce risks when a driver gets their probationary licence.
- The introduction of the Graduated Licensing System (GLS) has helped to reduce deaths and serious injuries of young drivers








Demerit Points:

* The **Demerit Points** Scheme is a national program that allocates penalty points (demerits) for a range of driving offences. A driver who has not committed any offences has '**zero**' points. If you commit an offence that carries demerit points, the points are added to your driving record.

If you incur the threshold number of demerit points within a three-year period, a licence suspension or refusal is applied. The three-year period is calculated between the dates the offences were committed. It ends on the day your most recent offence was committed. - Chat to your child about tapping on and tapping off on every journey
- Apply for a replacement School Opal card if your child has misplaced theirs

2023 School Bus Information Guide for Parents, Guardians and Students

Transdev NSW are proud to operate a range of school bus services on behalf of the NSW Government. This guide provides information about our services and how to get assistance if you need it.

How do I apply for a School Opal card/school travel pass?

All school students must travel with a valid School Opal card or Child/ Youth Opal card. Students may be eligible for free or subsidised travel to and from school or TAFE under the *School Student Travel Scheme*. School Opal cards/school travel passes are issued to eligible students by Transport for NSW. For details, visit https://transportnsw.info/school-travel-apply (School Student Transport Scheme website) or phone 131 500. If a student isn't eligible for a School Opal card, they must carry a valid Child/Youth Opal card.

Why is it important for students to tap on and off?

It is a condition of use that all students tap on and off with a valid Opal card each time they travel. This helps to ensure accurate patronage data is available, which is monitored by Transport for NSW. The more accurate data we have on patronage, the more we can ensure adequate services that meet the needs of your school community.



What can parents or guardians do to help?

Please ensure that your child has a valid Opal card for travelling to and from school, ready for when school returns in Term 1, 2023. Apply for a School Opal card or school travel pass at https://transportnsw.info/school-travel-apply. Encourage your child to have their card ready when boarding and to tap on and off every time they use a public bus service.

How can I provide feedback?

Please speak directly with your school in the first instance. We actively encourage direct communication with schools and will do our very best to resolve any matters as quickly as possible, working with your school in doing so. If you wish to lodge feedback, visit https://transportnsw.info/contact-us/feedback or phone 131 500. Your feedback will be processed and we will respond to you as soon as possible.

Where can I find my school's timetable?

Your school has access to current timetables with your allocated school services. Visit www.transdev.com.au/sydney-school-bus-timetables/ and simply enter your school name to download a relevant timetable. If regular route services operate nearby your school or home, you can access a timetable via https://transportnsw.info/routes/bus or plan your complete trip at https://transportnsw.info/trip#/trip - you can refine your search to add additional modes or a school route.

What if my child has lost property on a school service?

Visit https://transportnsw.info/contact-us/report-lost-property#/what-have-you-lost to report a missing item. Our drivers regularly check our buses for lost property. All lost property is logged and our Customer Experience Team will contact you directly if your missing item has been located and let you know where you can pick it up from.
