Constable Coppard presented to the Stage 3 students, focusing on cyber safety, online apps, bullying and unsafe health practices. The teachers and I were extremely impressed with the student's attention and the variety of questions that were asked by the students. Our aim is to continue to highlight how important it is for young children to be safe online, treat others with respect and know how to seek help. Rubik's Cube Club – A robot was in the house!

We were given a real treat on Tuesday, when Leo and his dad shared the most amazing robot that Leo has built. It can solve a Rubik's cube in less than 90 seconds. We started the Rubik's cube club to engage our students in a quieter space away from the hustle and bustle of the playground. Personally, I was in much need of tutoring, as I have never been able to solve a cube. I still can't solve one, but I am certainly well on my way! Listening to Leo explain how he built his robot and watching it solve a cube was mesmerising. Some of our Rubik's speed solvers tried to race the robot. Emergency and Bushfire Plans

Our school is in a bushfire prone area and is listed as Category 2 on the NSW Department of Education's bushfire risk register.

Category 2 Schools means - Schools in bushfire-prone areas with high landscape-to-site bushfire risk. The

department will direct the school to proactively temporarily cease school operations on days when a Catastrophic Fire Danger Rating has been declared for the following day, or on advice from emergency services or the State Emergency Operations Centre.

We have included a two-page Bushfire Danger Period Information to Parents which includes updates to bushfire signage and suggests important



ways to keep up to date and alert in the bushfire season. The 'Fires Near Me' app provides information from the NSW Rural Fire Service.



Bushfire Danger Period Information for Parents and Carers

This brochure provides information for parents and carers about arrangements for the bushfire danger period.

The NSW Department of Education has engaged external experts to conduct assessments of all NSW government schools to identify schools at greater risk of impact from bushfires.

To support the health, safety and wellbeing of students and staff in your school, the department in consultation with NSW Rural Fire Service, will direct the school to temporarily cease operations on days when a Catastrophic Fire Danger Rating has been declared for your school's NSW Fire Area. Alternative learning arrangements will be put in place for these days.

In addition, schools may be made non-operational due to changing higher risk conditions and relevant advice from emergency services.



What is a Fire Danger Rating?

Fire Danger Ratings describe the potential level of danger should a fire start. The ratings are determined by a combination of factors including air temperature, relative humidity, wind speed and drought. The new Australian Fire Danger Rating System has four ratings; Moderate, High, Extreme and Catastrophic.

When will I know if my child's school has been made non-operational?

At approximately 4:00 pm each day the Fire Danger Rating is issued for the following day. This means that schools, including onsite preschools, will be notified after school hours that it will be non-operational the following day. Your school will notify you as soon as possible by the preferred method of communication.

Parents and carers are requested to:

- Provide up-to-date home and after-hours contact details to your school.
- Stay up-to-date with news and local media a through the bushfire danger period.

Be prepared and make sure you have your Bushfire Survival Plan in place. The NSW Rural Fire Service has resources for all residents to plan and prepare for the bushfire season. Consider whether your home is safe from bushfires and grassfires and be prepared to relocate to a safer place well in advance.

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
