Zones of Regulation

We are continuing to learn an emotional regulation tool each week during Term 4. Here are the tools for weeks 4, 5 and 6. Try them at home when you feel yourself slip out of your calm state and are unable to meet your goals due to too much emotion/energy. Which one works best for you?

Week 4 : Stretch It Out



While sitting or standing, stretch your body. Stretch your arms to the sky and reach from side to side. Stretch your legs out tall. Move your head from one shoulder to the other. Roll your shoulders in a circle. Twist out your torso.

Why to try?

Stretching improves posture, brings awareness to muscles, and relieves tension. It can also help to wake up our senses.



Week 5 : Tunnel Breathing

Cover your ears with your hands to block out other sounds. Pay attention to the sound of your breath while taking deep breaths in and out. Notice how your breathing is louder, like being in a tunnel.

Why to try?

Deep breathing allows our body to slowly relax. The focus on the sound of our breath helps our brain shift to the present.



Week 6 : Toe Wiggles

Curl or move your toes back and forth and up and down. You can do this in your shoes, socks, or barefoot. Try crossing your toes over each other for an added challenge, just like crossing your fingers.

Why to try?

This can be done anywhere, anytime and can be used as a way to fidget while not distracting others or drawing attention to ourselves. It makes a great substitute for a hand fidget.




