## Zones of Regulation


Check-in : How are you feeling this week, today, this minute? What Zone are you in?

Rub your hands together quickly. When they are warm, place the palms of your hands over your eye sockets. Relax and feel the warmth and comfort soak in.

**Why to try?**

Learning to take a mindful minute and use simple self-soothing techniques helps to calm our system.

Our next step, in the remaining weeks, is making our Emotional Toolbox to help us when we are in each Zone. You could talk about this with your children and create your own Toolbox. We all need one!

## 2025 Enrichment Class Application

Dear Parents,

The enrichment class, or high achievers' class, caters for students who are talented in literacy, numeracy, arts, science and technology, and provides challenging enrichment and extension opportunities, including creative and critical thinking. Students who are achieving results above average and enjoy being challenged may find this class rewarding.

There are multiple criteria, including parent nomination (form attached), Primary School Principal recommendation and primary school data, which are used to determine the class and to ensure the selection process is fair and reliable.

### How do I apply?

Print and complete the 'Asquith Boys High School - Enrichment Class Application Form' and attach the required supporting documentation in a display folder. **Submit this application to Asquith Boys High School by Monday, 11 December, 2023. DO NOT** submit this application to your primary school.

Applications will be accepted after this date, however, as there may be no vacancies in the class, students may be placed on the waiting list.

### When will I find out whether my child has been successful in their application?

You will receive notification of your placement in the Asquith Boys High School - 2025 Enrichment Class by the end of Term 1, 2024.

Parents are requested to contact the school to accept or decline this position early in Term 2. Students may be placed on a waiting list. In the event a placement becomes available, you may receive confirmation at any time throughout 2024.

### What should my child's Portfolio include?

It is important to include the following:

- *Application Form (included) pages 1-3;*
- *Semester 1 and 2 (if it has been issued) report from Year 5;*
- *A piece of Year 5 writing of which your child is proud. Include an explanation of what the text was eg: a class test, an assignment, a polished piece etc.*

You may also wish to include:

- *One other piece of Year 5 work eg: a Mathematics test if your child is good at Maths;*
- *Certificates from Mathematics, English, Science, Spelling etc UNSW competitions*
- *Any external certificates eg. Music examinations*

**Please do not submit original items, only submit copies.**

**Also, be advised that further information may be requested by the Asquith Boys High School panel to assist in the selection process.**

**Will my child be disadvantaged if they are not selected for the enrichment class?**

No, all of Year 7 have many opportunities open to them including leadership teams, debating and speaking teams, Concert band, to name a few.

**Will my child remain in the class all year?**

Class placement is reviewed every semester. If a child is not happy or progressing appropriately, an interview with the Year Adviser may determine whether a more appropriate placing can be found in another class. Similarly, students in the mixed ability classes may be demonstrating high levels of achievement and may be better placed in the enrichment class.

**What if I am undecided?**

Fill in the form, talk to your primary school teacher and make your decision after this. You know your child better than others. Consider their attitude to learning and whether they are better off working in a more competitive environment and enjoy the challenge of higher order thinking and faster pace of learning.

**What is the selection process?**

The Enrichment Panel from our school will look at the portfolio that you have submitted and, if needed, seek clarification from your child's primary school. The panel will decide whether this class would be the most appropriate environment for your child.

**What if I have more questions?**


