We have greatly appreciated the wonderful work of our temporary teachers and non-teaching staff in 2023. For 2024, there are currently no part-time or fulltime temporary teacher or non-teaching positions. Thank you to Mrs Lucchese, Mrs Mitchell, Miss Tierney, Mr Walker, Miss Krust, Mrs Hart and Mrs Henley-Fox. We value the contributions and dedication you have provided to Wideview. We are certainly hopeful to be seeing these staff in 2024 in a casual capacity.

In 2023, the Department of Education offered permanent positions to non-teaching and teaching staff who met the requirements of the temporary to permanent transition program.

We are delighted to congratulate the following staff on the permanent appointments with the DoE which commence in 2024. Mrs McGirr has received permanency of 3 days a week. Mrs Anthonisz has increased her permanency allocation to four days a week. Two of our wonderful SLSO staff, Mrs White and Mrs Gibson, are both now permanent also. Two of our administrative staff, Mrs Gibson (library assistant) and Mrs Fieramosca (front office) have received permanency or increased their permanency allocation.

School organisation and class formations 2024

Placing students into their new classes each year is an important and complex process. This includes teachers and I determining class placements to ensure a smooth transition for all students. All students have been given the opportunity to share with their current teacher, a list of peers who they work well with. Each year, we do our best to create positive and productive learning environments.

With our student enrolments fluctuating, we are unable to determine our final class structures. We will confirm our 2024 class structures in the new year. We are anticipating that in 2024, we will have 12 classes across K-6. We are very close to maintaining 13 classes, hence the patience required in waiting until 2024. Our classes, where possible, will be grade based in 2024. Our class structures are created based on the number of students in grades and with strong teaching and learning objectives in mind.

We bid a sad farewell to families who are not returning to Wideview in 2024. Some families are moving interstate or to other areas of Sydney. We thank you for being a part of the Wideview community and wish you and your children well. Please contact the school in writing if your child/ren are not returning to Wideview in 2024. This information supports us to have the most accurate student enrolment numbers. It is also helpful to inform us of your child's last day in attendance and the name of their new school.

We welcome new families to the Wideview community in 2024. Spread the word and share how amazing our school is. We would love to welcome more families to our school for the commencement of 2024.

P&C Update

Wishing everyone a wonderful break

Thanks to Kiri for organising the showcase tickets, seating and volunteers. Thanks to all the parent helpers who assisted and created those amazing decorations for showcase. It was phenomenal. We wish to thank Mr Harper and Mrs Griffin for all their hard work along with all the class teachers and of course the students for a wonderful performance.

The P&C have had an amazing year, I would like to share some of the incredible achievements:

- WOOSHC had more than 20,000 enrolments for vacation and before and after school care
- Canteen sold over 7,000 combined recess and lunch orders, which included cooking more than 14,000 chicken nuggets
- Uniform shop sold more than 2,500 uniform items
- Senior band, Junior band and Recorder groups have performed 12 times with 61 students combined

We had a lot of fantastic community events this year:

- We started the year with a free movie night under the stars
- The Winter wonderland fete was a huge success raising more than \$30,000
- More than 200 students attended our Term 4 disco.
- Mother's and Father's Day stalls provided the students with a selection of lovely gifts to choose from
- P&C have helped with selling more than 700 showcase tickets, organising seating and providing ushers for performances

P&C have donated to the school to help support teachers and provide for students:

- \$2,500 for new sound equipment
- \$31,000 towards the recent canteen upgrade

- \$16,000 for "teachers wishlist" including texts and resources for teachers, sport and media equipment, representative sport uniforms, chairs, paint and more to come...
- \$30,000 to be donated towards oval upgrade (once we are [hopefully] successful in a recently lodged \$150,000 Community Partnership Grant)
- 39 hats donated to kindy 2024

We thank our 32 P&C committee members plus the whole Wideview community for their continued support of the P&C initiatives, Wideview school, school staff and students. We could not achieve all the above without your help. We provide facilities, organise events and give back. Please consider getting involved next year if you can.




Donations to the Wideview P&C Building Fund
