Term One Student Attendance

Our student attendance rate continues to be pleasing. 72.6% of our students have attended school at or above 90% of the time this term. Our overall attendance rate is 92.9%. We are extremely proud of our continued positive attendance rates! Keep it up Wideview!


What are opportunity classes?

Opportunity classes cater for high potential and intellectually gifted students in Year 5 and 6. Parents apply when students are in Year 4 for placement in Years 5 and 6. It is a two-year program. Parents cannot apply for Year 6 placement only.

Zones of Regulation

Sometimes a child's reaction to an unexpected event is much bigger than the size of the problem. This first visual is very helpful, once the child is calm, to discuss how big they saw the problem and reflect on their reaction. You can go through the visual with them thinking what types on events constitute each column on the graph and what an appropriate reaction could be - like the "How Would I Rate My Problem?" example.

On Tuesday 2 April three of our super swimmers took to the pool at Sydney Olympic Park for the Sydney North Swimming Carnival. Here's what they had to say about their day:

Aysha C: Last Tuesday Carter B, Luke A and I went to the Area Swimming Carnival at the Sydney Olympic pool. The events that I was in were 50 metres freestyle, 50 metres butterfly and 50 metres backstroke. My first race was freestyle. I got so nervous that I nearly ripped my wobbly tooth out! But once I was on the blocks I felt like I was ready to swim my hardest. There were very fast swimmers in my race so I got 6th. I got a new PB. It was 34.34 and I was very happy. My next race was backstroke. I wasn't that nervous because I had already done my first race but that didn't mean I wasn't scared. The whistle blew and I jumped into the water and held the bars ready to push off. I swam as hard as I could and I came 6th again and I got another PB. My last race was butterfly. I was already so tired. I went down to get marshalled and I was in the last heat so I had some time to catch my breath. I got up onto the block and dived in. At the end I was so tired! I looked at my time. It was 40.something. At the end when I drove home I got some delicious sushi. I had such a fun day!

Carter B: I entered the carnival as the top ranked swimmer in the whole of Hornsby Zone. I did very well in the 50m freestyle and I ended up coming 11th out of 24 swimmers and as well came 18th out of 24 swimmers in my breaststroke race as well. I was the reserve swimmer to race in the finals but everyone was there so I didn't get to race but at the end of the day it was just a race and I was still happy with myself because it's a good job to even make it to Area. Also I got a pb in my 50m breastroke!

Luke A: I arrived at the gate at 8 and went straight in to do my warm up, I found my seat and bought a cap and I went straight down to the 50 metre pool and I dived off the dive block and did 25 free to warm up. Then I got out and I did 25 fly I did that a couple times then I worked on my finishes. I got out because the warm up was finishing so I walked up to my seat, got some food and waited for my race which started at 10:23. When it was finally time for marshalling I ran down because I was so excited. When I was waiting for my race in the seats in front of the blocks I was really nervous because last time I was at Area I false started and I was really sad because that could have been my only chance to go to Area. So this was my chance to

redeem myself! No pressure! When I was getting ready to swim I was just trying to make sure that I didn't false start and I didn't. I swam a 35.22 which is a PB and I came 28th out of 38. Then I had to wait for butterfly which took forever so my mum bought me some dino nuggets and chips that tasted really good. As luck would have it, mum's phone rang and we didn't hear the marshalling call for butterfly. This also happened to me the last time I was at Area. Why me?!? Luckily I zoomed down just in time and despite almost missing my race they let me in the marshalling line. Phew! I went up to the blocks and swam the fastest butterfly lap I have ever swam and I swam a 42.38 and came 18th out of 28 and got a PB. I was really happy with how I went overall and I got a school day dedicated to swimming!




