On the day we met School Captains from the Hornsby School district.

Opportunity Class and Selective School Applications – Open until 21 February 2025

From 2025, the placement tests for selective high schools and opportunity classes will move from single version paper-based tests to computer-based tests. There will also be changes to the application process for 2026 entry to selective high schools and opportunity classes.

These changes will result in:

- a more engaging experience for students with computer-based testing
- a longer application period for parents and carers to apply
- more choice for parents and carers of when their child will sit a placement test
- outcomes being released earlier to parents and carers.

The test structure for each test is not changing in 2025: The Selective High School Placement Test will continue to have 4 sections (Reading, Mathematical reasoning, Thinking skills and Writing).

The Opportunity Class Placement Test will continue to have 3 sections (Reading, Mathematical reasoning and Thinking skills).

This change to the application period means that parents and carers will now need to apply for opportunity class placement when their child is in Year 3 (or by the end of Week 4, Term 1 when their child is in Year 4).

This change applies to students currently in Year 3. For selective high school placement, parents and carers will continue to apply when their child is in Year 5 and can now apply when their child is in year 6 until the end of Week 4, Term 1.

Please see below some questions and links to register for an opportunity class and selective high school placement test in 2025.

What are opportunity classes?

Opportunity classes are offered in primary school from Years 5 to 6.

There is also an <u>online opportunity class</u> for students in rural and remote areas. Students attend a local host school and complete their maths and science and technology lessons online through Aurora College.

Parents/carers apply for opportunity class placement when their child is in Year 3 and can apply up until 21 February 2025, when their child is in Year 4.

You can include up to 4 school choices when you are applying for an opportunity class.

What are selective high schools?

<u>Selective high schools</u> are offered in high school from Years 7 to 12. Parents/carers apply when their child is in Year 5 and can apply up until 21 February 2025, when their child is in Year 6. There are 4 types of selective high schools:

- fully selective high schools (where all students attending the school have high potential or are gifted)
- partially selective high schools (where one or two classes in each year are academically selective, with some non-selective classes for local students.)
- selective agricultural high schools (day or boarding schools that emphasise the study of agriculture)
- Aurora College (a virtual selective high school students attend a local host school and complete their English, mathematics and science lessons online with their Aurora classmates).

You can include up to 3 school choices when you are applying for a selective high school.

How do I apply for entry into an opportunity class or selective high school for my child?

Parents/carers should visit the <u>selective high schools and opportunity classes website</u> to learn more about opportunity classes and selective high schools and complete an <u>online application</u>.

How should my child prepare for the placement tests?

Students may like to do a small amount of preparation for the placement test using the department's <u>free</u> resources so they know what to expect on test day:

Applying for an opportunity class: Student resource hub

Applying for a selective high school: Student resource hub.

Some practice helps students feel confident and prepared. Coaching is not necessary for sitting the OC and SHS placement tests nor is it endorsed by the NSW Department of Education.

- 4. Select the Year Group Pack and/or items you would like to purchase and click "PURCHASE"
