NAPLAN 2025

NAPLAN testing for our Year 3 and Year 5 students has finished for another year. Well done to these students for trying their best. Thank you to Mr Curran and Mrs Anthonisz for supporting the organisation of NAPLAN and to all staff who led different sessions. Two days of catch-up sessions were organised to support students who were absent on any of the test days. When the results are released, parents will receive a NAPLAN style report highlighting areas of strengths and areas for improvement. The school uses NAPLAN data in triangulation with school informed data sources for individual, group and cohort improvement areas.

Cross Country Carnival – Thursday 8 May - Week 2 Term 2

All families will receive cross country information before the end of Term 1. There is no cost to this event. Students in Year 2 who are turning 8 in 2025 will have the option to run the primary course or stay on the K-2 shorter course. We are holding the carnival on school site. Leading up to the day, teachers will support the students to run the track as part of weekly sport and fitness.

Presenting The Calm Cove

We are delighted to share a new lunchtime space that we are providing to any of our students who need a quieter place to spend their lunch break. For some of our students, the unstructured nature and noise of a playground can be overwhelming and over stimulating. The Calm Cove is now open every lunch break from 1:35-2:00pm.



Aboriginal Artist Visit

We were delighted to welcome a local Aboriginal artist to our school recently. Courtney met with some of our senior leaders and Aboriginal students to share about her background and passion for designing indigenous images. The students were fascinated by Courtney's talent in visual arts and listened while Courtney shared how she designs images for different schools. The students worked together in small groups to share their thoughts on what important images would connect to them and our school site and community. Miss Hefford and I were so impressed with the conversations being had and the designs created by the students. Each group presented their ideas to Courtney and their peers. Courtney has taken the designs from each group and is creating a visual representation to share back with us. So many of the students wanted to share their connection to family, connecting with others, a journey and the waterways and bushland that surround our school.

Moving to High School in 2026 - EOI Closing Friday 28 March

All Year 6 families were sent information regarding the online process to complete high school applications for 2026. The Expression of Interest (EOI) lets you indicate which school(s) you would like your child to attend in Year 7. After you submit an EOI and it has been assessed, your child will be offered a place at a high school. If your child will not be attending a NSW Government high school next year, complete the Placement Not Required online form. If you are unsure whether they will be attending a NSW Government school (you've applied for a non-government school or you are moving interstate), we ask that you still complete an EOI and follow up with the school once a decision has been made. The online process will guide you through your options and collect the information required to make the process as smooth as possible. 



Excursion bookings will NOT be cancelled/removed unless it can be filled due to bus bookings and staffing.




